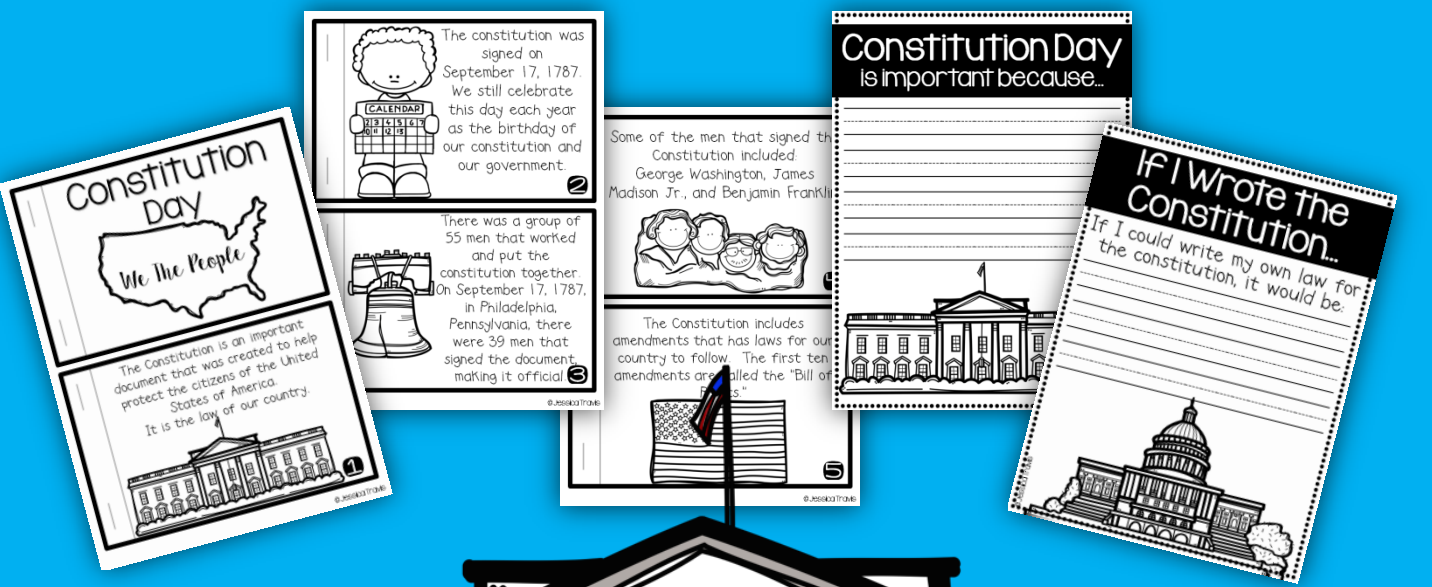

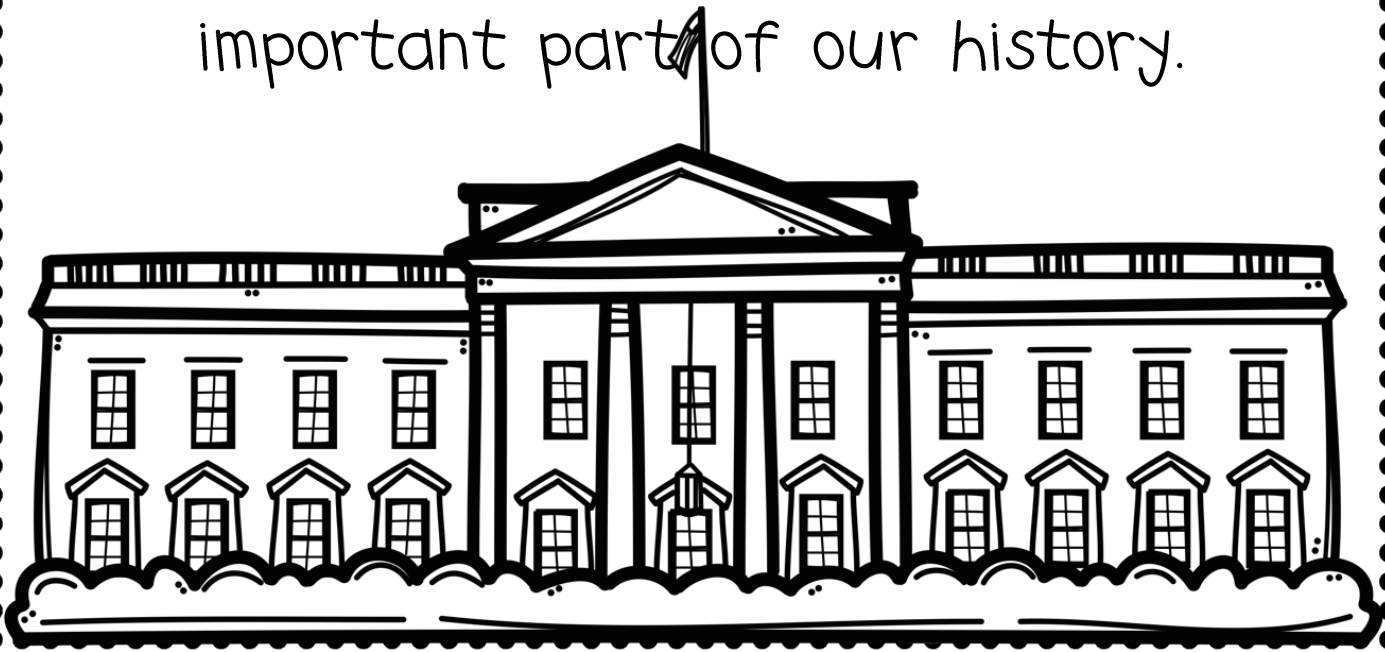


Constitution Day

This booklet will hopefully put these much larger and difficult concepts into a simple version to help your students get a better understanding of such an important part of our history.



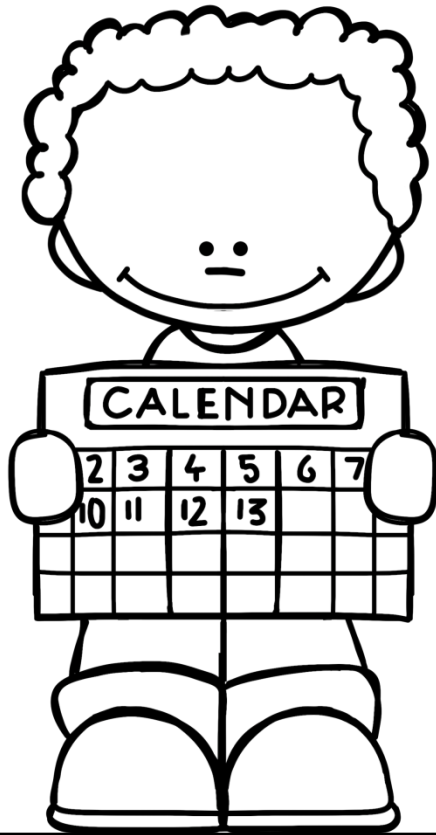
Constitution Day



The Constitution is an important document that was created to help protect the citizens of the United States of America.

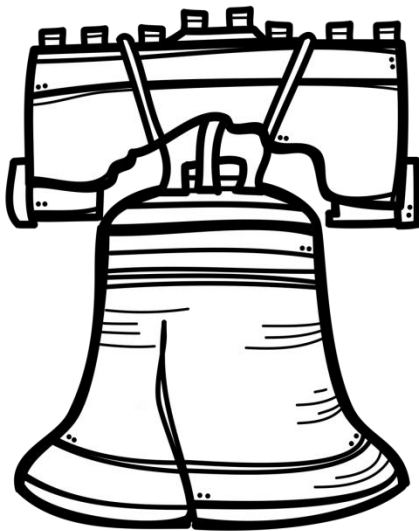
It is the law of our country.

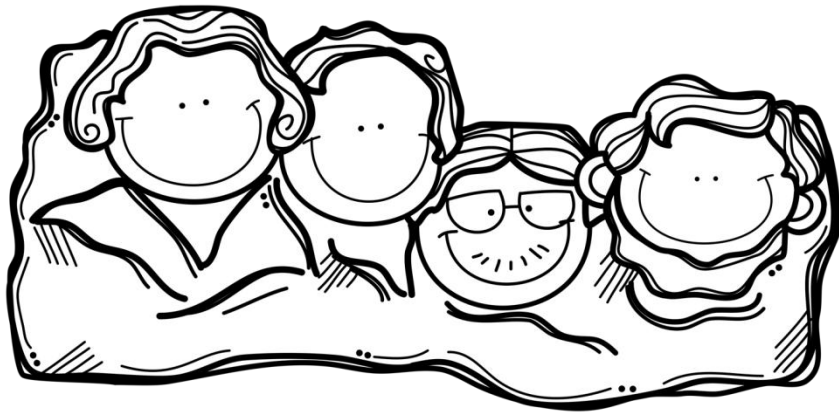


There was a group of 55 men that worked and put the constitution together. On September 17, 1787, in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, there were 39 men that signed the document, making it official.

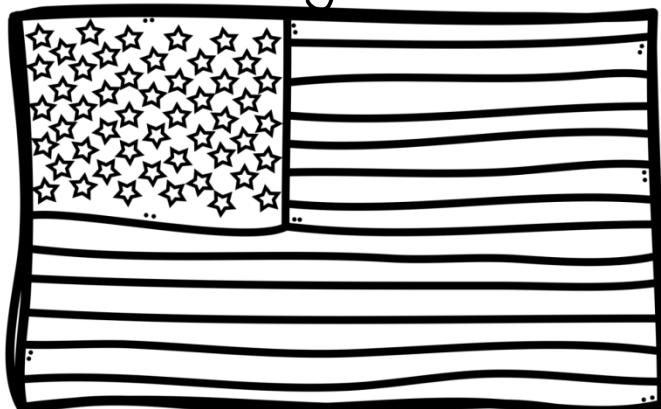
Some of the men that signed the Constitution included:

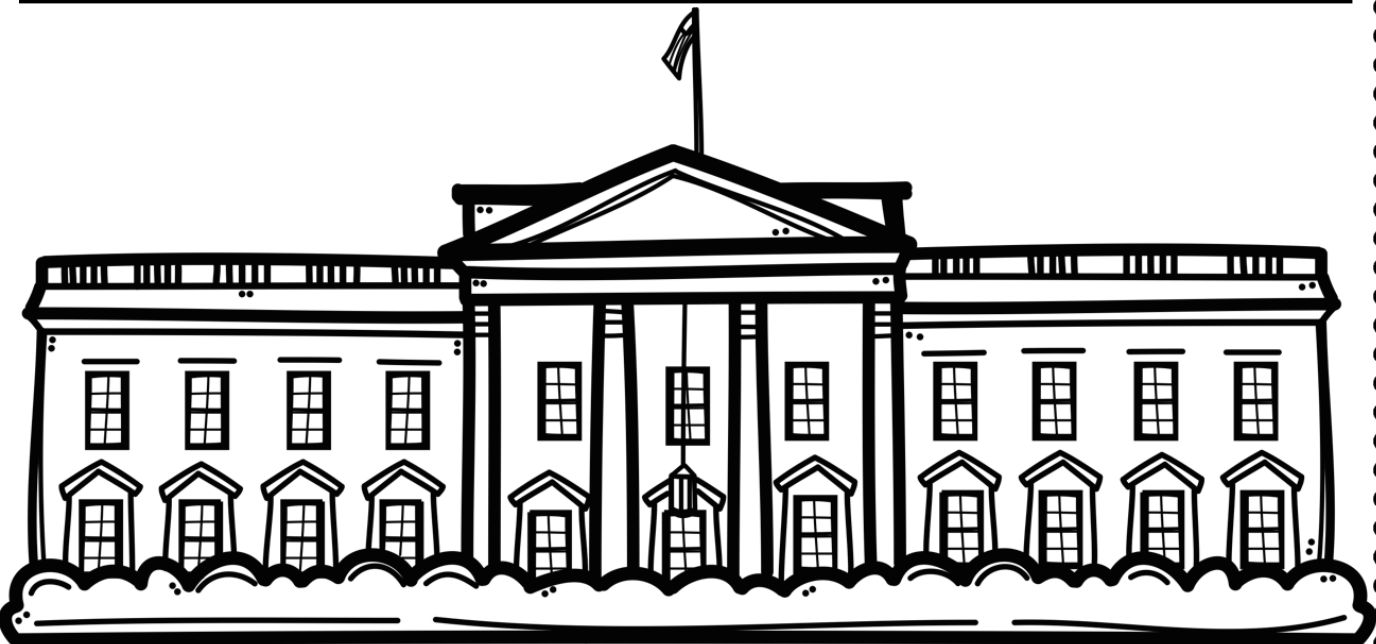
The Constitution includes amendments that have laws for our country to follow. The first ten amendments are called the "Bill of Rights."

Constitution Day is important because...

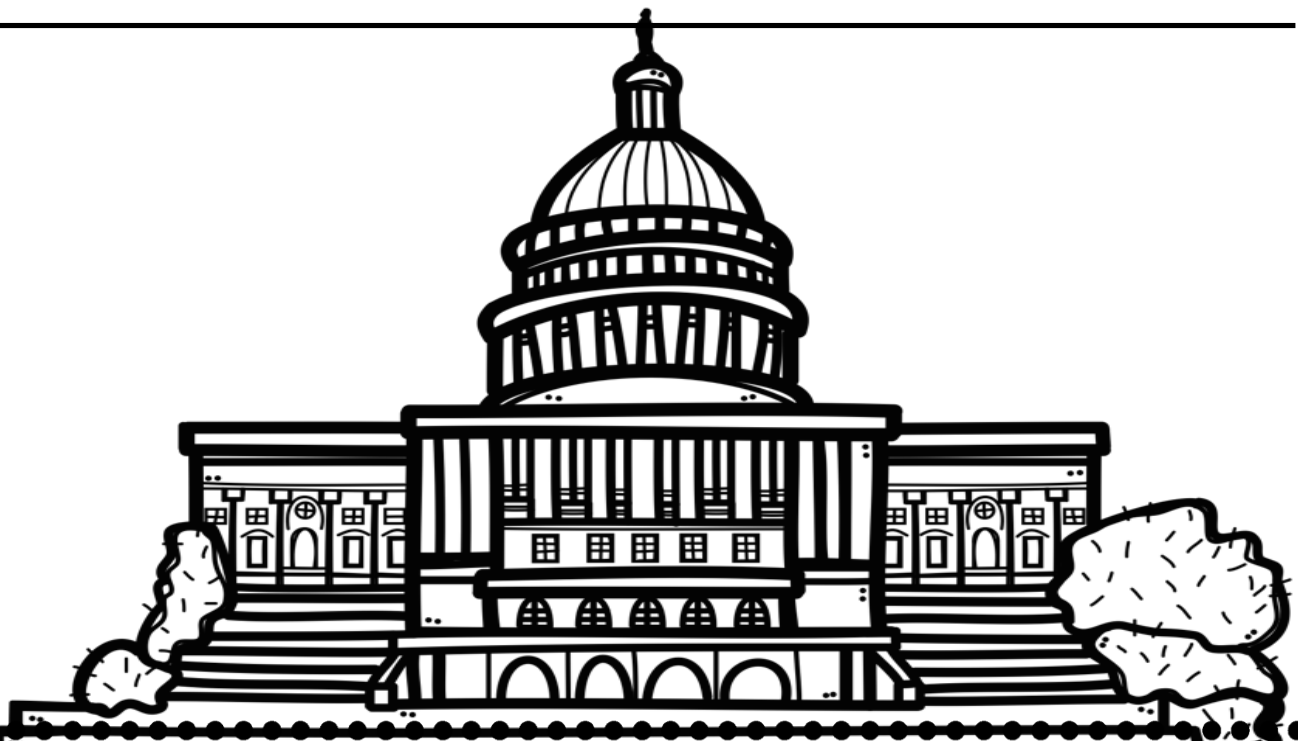
Handwriting practice area with four sets of lines: a solid top line, a dashed middle line, and a solid bottom line.
